



Windows 7 Wireless Instructions

1. Check to make sure that your wireless adapter is turned on:
 - a. Go to Start Menu and click Control Panel.




- b. Click Network and Internet.




- c. Click Network and Sharing Center.



- d. In the Network and Sharing Center navigation window click on Change Adapter Settings.




- e. Right Click on your wireless adapter icon and choose Enable if the adapter has been disabled.




2. Check to make sure that your wireless adapter is configured for automatic IP configuration and automatic DNS configuration:


- a. Right click on your wireless adapter icon and choose Properties.




- b. Select Internet Protocol Version 4 (TCP/IPv4) then click the Properties button.



- c. On the General Tab be sure that the radio buttons for Obtain an IP address automatically and the radio button for Obtain DNS server address automatically are selected.




- d. Click on the Alternate Configuration tab and check that the radio button for Automatic private IP address is checked. Click OK on both windows to close.




3. Now Connect to the Boston Public Library wireless:


a. Right click on the wireless adapter and click on Connect/Disconnect.



b. Click the Boston Public Library SSID and click Connect.



c. Once connected, close the network connections window and open Internet Explorer. You should now see the Boston Public Library Splash Screen. You will have to click Submit to accept the terms of use.



- d. Once you see the Boston Public Library homepage, you are connected to the wireless network and now able to access other Internet resources.
