BPL Special Collections Committee Charter & Principles (Draft)

BPL Mission Statement:

"The Boston Public Library provides educational and cultural enrichment, free to all, for the residents of Boston, Massachusetts and beyond, through its collections, services, programs, and spaces."

Composition:

Individuals from the community at large, the President of the BPL and Trustees or designee will serve on the Special Collections Committee consistent with our goal of increasing governance transparency and the breadth of citizen input. The appointment of committee members and the selection of committee Chair and Vice Chair are made by the Chair of the Board. The President of the Library will be a voting member of the committee. Additional staff roles will be appointed as non-voting ex-officio members.

Process requirements:

The Committee shall report at least once annually to the Board of Trustees on its activities. The work of the Committee is intended to guide the Library's Special Collections work and related activities only in matters of governance, policy, and strategy.

BPL Special Collections Committee Charter & Principles (Draft)

PURPOSE:

- **1.** To advocate for BPL's special collections, their long-term care and activation and for their centrality in the execution of the BPL's overall mission.
- 2. To review and advise on all relevant policies that affect stewardship of and access to special collections.
- 3. To receive reports on and recommendations for issues affecting special collections and comment as appropriate.
- 4. To work to foster and enhance alignment between special collections, library services, and the needs of BPL's communities of users.
- 5. To support and promote greater access to and engagement with special collections in accordance with approved BPL strategy.
- 6. Provide recommendations to the Board of Trustees on special collections matters requiring full board approval.
- 7. To advise of potential new funding and/or partnership opportunities in support of special collections stewardship and outreach.
- 8. To acknowledge and foster affiliate and strategic partnership relationships that have a focus on advancing the library's priorities for and work with Special Collections.
- **9.** To support the development of a long-range strategic plan for the Special Collections Departments, consistent with the library's overall strategic planning documents and processes.
- **10.** To advocate for and support capital project initiatives in service of the Special Collections.
