1. Power On

If device is not powered on, press the power button in top right of the keyboard.

If the device doesn't turn on, plug it in with the power cord until charged.

2. Connect to Wi-Fi or Mobile Data Network

Chromebooks automatically connect to BPL Wi-Fi networks and come with a built-in T-Mobile Mobile Data Network that you can always connect to from any location, even if you don't have Wi-Fi access. You can also manually connect to a local Wi-Fi network if you prefer.

1. Click on the Quick Settings Panel at the bottom right of your screen.
2. Click on the 'No Network' icon.
3. Select your Wi-Fi Network or the T-Mobile Mobile Data Network.
4. If needed, enter Wi-Fi password.

3. Log in
